Suitable for all those interested in dressmaking, from complete beginners to the more experienced wanting to brush up their skills. You will be guided through the purchase of fabrics and patterns. You will learn how to make basic pattern alterations, cut out, assemble and fit garments. You will also be taught basic dressmaking techniques and make samples to practise your skills.

There will be plenty of help with using a sewing machine if required. More advanced learners will be encouraged to make more complicated garments. There are some sewing machines available at the College.

### Learning outcome

All dressmaking classes include students with various levels of experience.

### How progress & success will be recorded

Samples kept by students, plus photographs and completed garments.

### By the end of this course learners will have the opportunity to

- Know how to use a sewing machine.
- Learn how to use a domestic dressmaking pattern.
- Understand the importance of a well-fitted garment.
- Know how to assemble a garment in the correct order.
- Learn a variety of dressmaking skills, for example inserting zips, seam finishes, pockets, hems etc.

### What you need to bring to the first session

- Pencils and pens.
- Tape measure.
- An old sheet or quilt cover for samples.
- The Tutor advises all beginners **not** to buy a pattern and fabric before the first session.

### Extra Costs on the course

Basic tools and equipment for dressmaking will be discussed at the first session. In order to make a garment you will need to purchase fabric, pattern and thread. Each student will also need at least one metre of fabric to make their samples - an old sheet or quilt cover is ideal.

### On completion of the course, your next steps might be

To continue on the course and learn more advanced techniques.

### Enrolment and Fee Policy

- You can book your chosen course by completing a booking form and posting it with a cheque payable to Astrea Academy Trust for the course fee (please do not send cash).
- Material charges are not included in the course fee unless otherwise stated.
- We accept bookings over the phone, please have your credit/debit card to hand.
- We welcome enquiries by email but please DO NOT quote your card payment details on email.
- Enrolments are welcome throughout the year.
- Courses with fewer than the minimum number of learners may have the option of continuing on payment of supplementary fees.
- Fees are payable in full at the time of booking a course. We accept payment by all major debit and credit cards, cheques (payable to Astrea Academy Trust) or cash in person.
- Please note, should you withdraw from a course that continues to meet you will still be liable to pay any outstanding fees.
- Refunds will be paid in full if a class is unable to start due to insufficient enrolments.
- Refunds cannot be given if a course has already started, unless you cancel your place for medical reasons, in which case a Doctor's Certificate is required.
- Concessionary fees are available (proof will be required) if you are:
