Covering material found in Tap grades 3-6. If you've completed a year of our improvers course, this class is for you. Designed to teach rhythm, co-ordination and to build an understanding of technique, each session will consist of a warm-up, technique exercises and combinations which will be developed into engaging choreography. Whether you fancy yourself as the next Ginger Rogers or Fred Astaire, join us for a class incorporating fun with fitness and flair.

Learning aims

Students will learn the fundamental steps and be able to demonstrate these through different combinations and choreography to music. By the end of the course students will be able to recall sequences to build on their skills and movement memory, having gained improved confidence in their body and understanding of technique.

Extra costs on the course

It is highly recommended that students invest in a pair of tap shoes if they haven't done so already.

What you need to bring to the first session

Please wear suitable clothing for dance, such as leggings/jogging bottoms and a t-shirt. Tap shoes should ideally be worn but suitable footwear such as low-heeled ballroom/character shoes or jazz shoes may be appropriate initially. Tap is thirsty work so remember to also bring a bottle of water with you.

Enrolment and Fee Policy

You can book your chosen course by completing a booking form and posting it with a cheque payable to Astrea Academy Trust for the course fee (please do not send cash).

We accept bookings over the phone, please have your credit/debit card to hand.

We welcome enquiries by email but please DO NOT quote your card payment details.

Enrolments are welcome throughout the year.

Courses with fewer than the minimum number of learners may have the option of continuing on payment of supplementary fees.

Fees

Fees are payable in full at the time of booking a course. We accept payment by all major debit and credit cards, cheques (payable to Astrea Academy Trust) or cash in person.

Please note, should you withdraw from a course that continues to meet you will still be liable to pay any outstanding fees.

Refunds will be paid in full if a class is unable to start due to insufficient enrolments.

Refunds cannot be given if a course has already started, unless you cancel your place for medical reasons, in which case a Doctor's Certificate is required.
