Brief Description

Appliqué is a great way to customise clothing, add something special to patchwork quilts or decorate accessories and crafted gifts. If you already use appliqué in your work, this course will introduce you to new and different techniques.

Samples will be made of each of the appliqué techniques using various fabrics and all are stitched on the sewing machine. You can then choose at least one of the techniques to use on a bag, cushion or a block suitable for patchwork. Previous experience of appliqué is not necessary to join this course, but you should have some knowledge of your sewing machine and be able to use straight and zig-zag stitches.

Learning Outcome

Upon completion of this course, you will have notes and samples for reference.

You will also have a finished item and lots of ideas on how to use the new machine appliqué techniques in your work.

Requirements List

- A Sewing Machine and the Instruction Book—**machines must have a PAT certificate if over 1 year old.**
- Spare Machine Bobbins that are for the make and model of your machine.
- All the feet and accessories that came with the machine, incl the cleaning brush and foot pedal.
- Universal sewing machine needles sizes 80 & 90.
- Sewing machine Topstitch needle size 80 or 90.
- Sewing machine Wing needle size 100, or Wing needle or standard needle size 110.
- Pins. Cutting out scissors, a small pair of scissors and paper scissors.
- Fading Marker Pen.
- Pressing cloth.
- Selection of sewing threads, machine quilting threads and machine embroidery threads.*
- Can of 505 spray glue.*
- Reel of white bobbin thread and reel of wash away thread.
- Can of spray starch.
- Saucer or small dish and a small paint brush.
- A few sheets of A4 tracing paper.
- 50cm of plain fabric.
- 50cm of print fabric.
- 50cm of wadding.
- 50cm of tearaway stabiliser.
- 50cm of wash away (water soluble) stabiliser.
- 1 metre of 1cm (½”) bias binding or if you prefer you can make your own bias binding so bring enough fabric to cut about 1 metre.
- An A4 Folder for your notes and samples.
- Pen, pencil, a ruler and a tape measure.

Do try to keep to colour scheme for your fabrics and threads. All items marked * the tutor will bring for you to use if you do not have any.

The Projects

These techniques can be used on a variety of projects such as cushions, bags or patchwork blocks. If you have a project that you want to use one of the techniques on, then bring enough of two fabrics and more bias binding to tone or contrast to either make a cushion front or a patchwork block.

If you want to make the Easy Shoulder Bag, you will need the following:

- 2 sheets of A4 card or paper for the bag pattern.
- Fabric A - 2 pieces of fabric at least 35cm (14”) x 40cm (15”) for the handbag outer. Plain or printed, as you will be adding some decoration.
- Fabric B - 1 piece of fabric 35cm (14”) x 40cm (15”) for the decoration.
- Either 1.5 metres of 1cm (½”) bias binding or enough fabric to cut your own to tone/contrast with Fabric A and B.
- 2 pieces of lining fabric and 2 pieces of wadding the same size as your fabric.
- 2 x 15cm (6”) squares of fabric for the pocket.
- A strip of fabric 13cm (5”) x 80cm (32”) for the strap. This will give you a finished length of approximately 75cm (29”). Bring more fabric if you want a longer strap.
- 80cm (32”) of firm iron-on waistband interfacing. If you want a longer strap then bring the same amount as your strap fabric.
- 1 large button or a button to cover.
- Machine sewing thread to match your fabrics.
